RE: Tracking Legal Challenges to Federal Vaccine Mandates

Private Sector Employer Vaccine Mandate

On November 5, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) issued its COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) requiring employers with 100 or more employees to implement vaccination or testing policies for their workers. Over three dozen lawsuits were filed against the rule, with at least one in all 12 Circuit Courts in the country.

Federal Contractor Mandate

On September 9, President Biden issued <u>Executive Order 14042</u> (EO) requiring all federal contractors to mandate COVID-19 vaccinations for their employees. On October 7, the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Council issued the Deviation Clause to implement the EO. Numerous lawsuits have been filed against the mandate, but the District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky was the first to issue a substantive decision.

CMS Vaccine Mandate for Healthcare Workers

On November 5, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services issued a <u>rule</u> requiring healthcare workers in facilities that receive Medicare or Medicaid funds be vaccinated against COVID-19 by January 4, 2022. Four lawsuits were filed against CMS challenging the agency's authority to issue the rule. As it currently stands, the rule is in effect in CA, CO, CT, DE, FL, HI, IL, ME, MD, MA, MI, MN, NV, NJ, NM, NY, NC, OR, PA, RI, TN, VT, VA, WA, and WI.

District Court for the Western District of Louisiana	
Date	Activity
Nov 30, 2021	District Court for the Western District of Louisiana issued a preliminary injunction blocking enforcement of the mandate nationwide, except in the 10 states impacted by the Missouri ruling
	Appealed to the 5 th Circuit
Dec 15, 2021	5th Circuit upheld the injunction in the 14 states involved in the case: AL, AZ, GA, ID, IN, KY, LA, MS, MT, OH, OK, SC, UT, WV; refused to extend it to other states
Dec 16, 2021	Admin filed emergency application with the Supreme Court (<i>see chart above</i>)

District Court for the Northern District of Florida	
Date	Activity
Nov 20, 2021	Judge ruled against granting a temporary restraining order or preliminary injunction
Nov 23, 2021	Florida filed its appeal and motion for emergency injunction pending the appeal
	Judge declined to enter an emergency injunction but did offer to reconsider the original request for a preliminary injunction
Dec 6, 2021	11th Circuit upheld District Court decision and refused to enjoin the rule
Dec 16, 2021	Florida seeks rehearing <i>enbanc</i> before the 11 th Circuit
